Re: Budget 2023 must accelerate commitment to Agenda 2030 and reach the furthest behind first.

Dear Minister,

Budget Day marks almost seven years to the day since Ireland committed to Agenda 2030 and the 17 Sustainable Development Goals¹. This ambitious blueprint for sustainable policymaking addresses people, planet, prosperity, peace and partnership, and recognises that development is not sustainable when some are left behind². Current crises affirm that accelerated action is urgently needed. Budget 2023 must align with sustainable development goals, targets and principles to ensure we can offset the further deterioration of Irish society, economy and environment and put us on track for a better future for all.

Halfway to 2030, and Agenda 2030 and the achievement of the 17 SDGs are at risk. The Human Development Index value has declined for two years, a first in its 32-year history³. This brings us back to 2016 regarding progress on the Sustainable Development Goals. Families, communities and businesses across the country feel the impact. Sustainable development and associated budgeting ensure we meet the needs of the present without compromising the needs of future generations⁴.

Ireland has consistently shown laudable leadership and solidarity on the global stage. Our leadership in negotiating support for SDGs across 193 countries is an achievement of national pride, as is our seat on the UN Security Council. Our commitment to multilateralism is commendable, including a strong record in per capita aid contributions, recent commitments to address the crises in the Horn of Africa⁵ and advocacy to protect the people of Ukraine.

International crises, covid, climate, and conflict, impact nationally and have generated unparalleled uncertainty and instability. Budget 2023 should testify to Ireland's commitment to the SDGs at home and abroad as a solution to the most pressing problems in our society and our world. The Agenda 2030 blueprint should be at the centre of budgetary planning as we seek to address matters at the very core of its purpose. SDG budgeting⁶ processes and mechanisms support coherence across policy areas to ensure no one is left behind.

Minister, as we all seek more sustainable futures, we call on you through Budget 2023 to fully embrace and show leadership on the SDGs.
