The Irish National Teachers' Organisation (INTO) is the largest education union on the island of Ireland, representing over 55,000 teachers.

In our pre-budget submission, we are calling on the Government to increase teacher numbers so that Ireland's children can **THRIVE!**

Since August 2024, the Government has cut the number of mainstream class teachers by over 900, leaving Ireland's children languishing behind their European peers in overcrowded classrooms. The Government's failure to retain these vital teaching posts at a time when enrolment has been falling has done untold damage.

In the last three budgets, despite the Government's commitment to reduce class sizes to the EU average of 19, no changes have been made to the appointment and retention figures for primary teachers. Consequently, 80% of Ireland's pupils remain in classes above the EU average size.

The majority of children with additional needs attend mainstream schools. To maintain an inclusive education system, schools require urgent additional teaching support, yet many schools have seen their allocation of special education teachers (SET) reduced.

As well as this, the substitute supply panel scheme has not been expanded with the result that thousands of substitute positions are being filled by people without a primary teaching qualification.

Schools are also losing their administrative principals and deputy principals because the primary staffing schedule has not been adjusted for the last three years.

Furthermore, 75 small rural schools are under severe threat of closure. In the last year alone, at least 11 schools have closed permanently while others were amalgamated.

The Government is hoping that a redeveloped primary curriculum will support high-quality inclusive and evidence-based learning for all children, recognising the right of every child to prosper. That is a forlorn hope unless the major structural deficiencies in staffing, which threaten the viability of our primary schools, are fixed quickly.

From Budget 2027, 1,000 more primary teachers is the **minimum** required to start creating the right circumstances for Ireland's children to thrive.

Cost of Government inaction

- ▶ Overcrowded classes, much larger than the EU average.
- ▶ Number of mainstream teachers decimated.
- ▶ Thousands of substitute positions filled by unqualified personnel.
- ▶ Special/inclusive education lacks required teaching support.
- ▶ Successful implementation of redeveloped curriculum won't happen without qualified teachers being available.
- ▶ Over 75 small schools face threat of closure.

Cost of 1,000 more teachers

- ▶ Full-year cost of 1,000 more primary teachers is **€59.7 million**¹.
- ▶ As new teachers would not take up employment until September 2027, the cost for 2027 is just **€20 million**.
- ▶ Providing **1,000** more primary teachers would increase expenditure at Department of Education and Youth by only **0.5%** in 2027/28 school year².
